Museum Updates

Shockey wraps up construction on children’s museum, historic Glen Burnie House at MSV

Howard Shockey & Sons, Inc. recently completed the renovation, restoration and new construction of two museums.

As part of the Museum of the Shenandoah Valley’s (MSV) four-phase Master Plan, Shockey finished the first phase of restoration work on the Glen Burnie House.

Because of interactive updates, patrons will now be able to see how people actually lived in the house, said MSV’s Executive Director Dana Hand Evans.

While the updates did bring modern technology into the house, Hand Evans says that the structure kept all of its historic integrity.

Shockey also performed the Glen Burnie House’s last restoration in 1959.

Meanwhile, Shockey more than tripled space for the Shenandoah Valley Discovery Museum (SVDM). Its new facility allows for more energy and opportunities, according to Marketing and Advancement Director Chris Delaughter. ■

Shockey is Building \$50 Million Dairy Processing Plant

AUGUSTA COUNTY, Va. – One of the nation's largest family-owned and operated dairy processors is building its first East Coast plant in the Commonwealth of Virginia. Shamrock Farms, based in Arizona, is investing in Virginia with a \$50 million manufacturing facility.



The new plant will allow Shamrock to deliver its extended-shelf-life (ESL) milk products to customers across the country. In recent years, the Shamrock brand has expanded into convenience stores, groceries and quick-service restaurants such as Subway, Arby's and Einstein Brothers. Shamrock's Rockin' Refuel protein-fortified milk beverages are used by sports teams at 150 colleges and universities nationwide. All of these products will be made at the new facility.

Howard Shockey & Sons, Inc. is serving as general contractor on the project. ■

New manufacturing facility will provide first East Coast location for this Arizona-based company



Fast track to opening:

The team moved on site in June 2013; the first wall was up in October 2013; the facility will be operational in October 2014. When completed, the plant will employ up to 60 people.

Future growth:

The facility will measure 130,000 square feet initially, with room for expansion.

Partnership:

When Shamrock began the site selection process for its first East Coast facility at the end of 2011, it considered several locations, from New York to North Carolina. The Shenandoah Valley Partnership (SVP), a regional economic development organization, worked with Shamrock's real estate consultant to find available properties. A collaborative effort from all parts of the sum – Augusta County, the SVP, Howard Shockey & Sons, Inc., and Howard's sister company, Shockey Precast Group – has allowed the project to move forward quickly for Shamrock Farms.
