Richmond Mayor Opens School

Mayor Jones Visits Martin Luther King, Jr. Middle School; New Facility Prompts High Expectations from Students, Staff

RICHMOND, Va. - Calling for major improvements in achievement, Mayor Dwight C. Jones formally opened the \$40 million Martin Luther King Jr. Middle School in January. Hopes are high that the state-of-the-art school will be an incentive for students.

"We are raising expectations of what we want to see from our schools," Jones said to a standing room only crowd which included the school's 700 or so students, staff, and other city leaders.

Museum Reveals 10-Year Plan

WINCHESTER, Va. – The Museum of the Shenandoah Valley (MSV) has announced a new Master Plan to guide the development of its 214acre campus.

Howard Shockey & Sons, Inc. has been chosen as general contractor and has begun work on the first phase, which preserves and reinterprets the Glen Burnie House, restores the Glen Burnie Gardens, and installs a new Spring Garden for MSV. When the Glen Burnie House reopens in May of 2014, it will also be completely accessible to wheelchair use.

Shockey has projected cost to implement all four phases at \$26.4 million.
