Shockey Gets 11th PPP Award

HARRISONBURG, Va. — Shockey will build a maintenance facility and offices for Harrisonburg Department of Public Transportation (HDPT).

Howard Shockey & Sons, Inc. partnered with HDPT, RNL and Maintenance Design Group to build the \$14 million project.

HDPT received seven proposals for consideration. The project was procured under Virginia’s Public-Private Education and Infrastructure Act (PPEA) and when complete, it will be Shockey’s 11th PPP project.

HDPT maintains all public transportation in the City of Harrisonburg, K-12 school buses, and buses that serve the James Madison University campus.
